How does PDP operate?

Step 1:

Identification of potential beneficiaries:

- Potential beneficiaries will be identified by the Norwegian Embassy in Bucharest/Romanian cooperation partners and by Innovation Norway
- Expression of interest can also be done directly to one of the contact persons (see front page)

Step 2:

Pre-qualification (ref. selection criteria):

- All potential beneficiaries will go through an assessment of their suitability for the PDP and their requirement to succeed
- In Romania this assessment will be done by Romanian cooperation partners and/or the Royal Norwegian Embassy
- In Norway this assessment will be done by Innovation Norway

Step 3:

Partner search:

Partner search will be done:

- individually for a company accepted in the project
- during match making events - the Royal Norwegian Embassy/ Romanian cooperation partners and Innovation Norway will arrange one or more meeting places for each of the three main focus areas (the meeting places can be a separate match-making event especially organized for this Project or in connection with Trade Fairs, Conferences etc.). The events can be organised in Romania and/or in Norway

Step 4:

Consultancy/ other services:

- For potential partnerships (entities that find a potential partner during one of the match-making events) will be offered consultancy/other services to facilitate the further development of the partnership, to draft an initial market plan for Romania etc.

Step 5:

Business activities established in Romania:

- Signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (Letter of Intention to Cooperate) or similar between a Norwegian and a Romanian entity

Background information

Romania is a beneficiary of the Norwegian Cooperation Programme under the European Economic Area (EEA) Enlargement Agreement as of August 1st, 2007. The Norwegian Government made available EUR 48 million for co-financing of projects to contribute to innovation and technology exchange and business development between Romania and Norway.

The Norwegian Cooperation Programme with Romania aims to stimulate the economic growth and sustainable development and to strengthen the bilateral relations between the two countries. Innovation Norway, a state owned company under the Norwegian Ministry of Trade and Industry, is the fund manager and administrator of the Programme.
